Recreational Activities

- Removed basketball hoops at height of the pandemic to protect our residents. Once safe, reinstalled them to provide a recreational outlet for residents
- Drive-in Movies @ Hamilton Stage
- Youth Art workshops
- Splash Park at Brennan Field
- Outdoor Recreational Spaces offered to businesses
- Stein Field re-opening
- Installed a "creative inclusive activity panel play center" at Tully Field, for special needs children



Municipal Operations

- Continuity of Government Plan for stay-at-home order to ensure the public still has access to City Hall
- Closed municipal parks, the Rahway Public Library, Rahway Recreational Center, Rahway Senior Center ahead of the state
- Suspending meter parking as well as alternate side parking rules so homebound residents wouldn't have the additional burden of parking enforcement
- Took action providing taxpayers with 0% interest rate on property taxes before the Governor implemented his property tax extension
- Established queuing entry system for City Hall
- Established COVID website



City Planning/Development

- Issued over 200 Temporary
 Certificates of Occupancy
- Issued over 250 zoning permits
- Facilitated continued construction for major developments within the City (Meridia Brownstones and The Mint)
- Repaired roadway sinkholes (sewer utilities) at three locations
- Completed hydrant flushing City-wide
