Harriet Tubman Beacon of Hope Monument

February 2024

The Harriet Tubman – Beacon of Hope is a traveling monument that we will be hosting and displaying on City Hall Plaza during the month of February 2024. The bronze sculpture was created by artist Wesley Wofford and is traveling to Rahway from Salisbury, MD. The narrative of the sculpture depicts the transformation of young Araminta Ross into the American icon, Harriet Tubman, who dedicated her life to human rights and became a symbol of Freedom worldwide.

Rahway Murals

In September 2023, the first of two brand new murals was unveiled in downtown Rahway at 69-75 E. Cherry Street. Artist Andrey Kravtsov, known professionally as Key Detail, created a beautiful piece that focuses on climate change resiliency and coastal flooding awareness. The artwork features a river goddess surrounded by native aquatic animals commonly found in the Rahway River. This mural was funded through a grant from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

The second mural to be added to the City was completed in November 2023 at Arts District Park by artist Emilio Florentine. This vibrant artwork in the heart of our downtown features a variety of flowering perennials that are native to Rahway, depicted in Florentine's signature style.



City of Rahway Engineering Division

LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

In recent years, concerns over water distributed through lead service lines have heightened across communities throughout the State of New Jersey, underscoring the necessity for immediate measures. To address this urgent issue, the City of Rahway is taking steps to inventory and replace lead service lines – and we are looking to partner with residents and property owners to align with the State's goal to make New Jersey lead-free by 2031.

Mayor Giacobbe and the City of Rahway are committed to eliminating all service lines made of lead or having galvanized components from the water main to the meter on your property.

This matter is of such great importance to the City of Rahway that we have worked hard to obtain grants from our Federal, State and County legislators so that we can replace service lines at no charge to customers to ensure all residents and property owners have access to water free from lead. This is approximately a \$6,000-\$10,000 value per property, if contracted individually.

The replacement process will be expertly handled by licensed and insured plumbers through a contract with the City of Rahway, reducing disruptions or inconveniences for residents. The commitment to free replacements demonstrates our dedication to the well-being of our residents and property owners but we need your help. By allowing the City's contractors into your buildings for lead service line replacements, you actively contribute to creating a healthier, safer community.

If your property has been identified as having a service line made of lead or having galvanized components, you will receive communication requesting access to your property in order to replace your service line before the project progresses to your area.

The presence of lead in water poses severe health risks, especially for children, impacting cognitive development and overall well-being. It's a collective effort to ensure that every tap delivers water free from harmful contaminants, promoting a brighter, healthier future for all. We appreciate your cooperation and understanding with our request for assistance.

PAVEMENT ANALYSIS

PROGRAM

The City contracted with Advanced Infrastructure Design and the Colliers Engineering GIS Services Team to have the condition of every road in Rahway analyzed with the goal of improving the overall quality of the roads within the City. Data collection includes high-resolution video, a Laser Crack Measurement System and Ground Penetrating Radar for pavement thickness estimates and will all be tied to GPS coordinates for accuracy. This analysis will provide a data driven objective approach to prioritizing the roads that are in the greatest need of resurfacing. The data will also allow the Engineering Department to explore cost-effective, alternate methods of future road maintenance. The City is implementing this new technology to ensure the longevity of our existing road network.



BERZINEC PARK & HOWARD FIELD PARK

IMPROVEMENTS

This spring, we are looking forward to two of our City parks receiving several improvements. The tennis courts at Berzinec Park, located on Central Ave., will be resurfaced and receive new posts and nets. One court at the park will have a modular surface that can accommodate pickleball as well as tennis. These improvements are being partially funded through the 2022 Union County Kids Trust Fund grant and the 2022 Local Recreation Improvement Grant.

Additionally, Howard Field Park, located on Stockton St., will be receiving several upgrades. The basketball courts will be resurfaced and receive a new backboard, goals, nets, and benches, and a new walkway will be added between the play surfaces and courts. These improvements are being partially funded through the 2020 Union County Kids Trust Fund Grant.

RPD ADOPTS 21ST CENTURY COMMUNITY POLICING PHILOSOPHY

The Rahway Police Department has adopted a 21st century community policing philosophy called "Police2Peace." This grant-funded initiative and training platform is utilized by law enforcement agencies throughout the nation with the goal of improving relations between police officers and the communities they serve. By exploring the roots of policing back to its origins in the 1800's and explaining how various geographic areas of the United States developed different ideologies of public safety, officers gain a newfound understanding of the profession. Civilian personnel of the department also receive a modified version of the course.

Police2Peace has found great success by using a whole-community approach that does not just focus on law enforcement personnel but engages the community as well. Community leaders and elected officials participate in training modules geared towards civilians and non-law enforcement stakeholders. The training will be followed up in 2024 by information sharing sessions among all parties so that ideas and expectations can be shared and expressed to strengthen understanding.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

Rahway Police Department keeps the Community safe and informed



Part of keeping Rahway a terrific place to live, work, dine and shop is by keeping the community informed and prepared. Recent local and national crime trends (such as the spikes in catalytic converter theft, motor vehicle theft, and motor vehicle burglaries) have also affected Rahway. But there are ways citizens can protect themselves.

Here are a few tips:

- Have your catalytic converter engraved or stamped with your car's VIN number.
- Park in a well-lit area and consider investing in a doorbell camera.
- If you or a neighbor has been the victim of a crime, check for video doorbell and security camera footage of the incident and contact the Police Department promptly.
- Lock your vehicles, take your key fob with you, and keep items of value and loose change well hidden and out of sight.
- Secure your home with dead bolt locks on exterior doors, lock windows and sliding doors, and keep vehicle key fobs in safe locations, not visible from the exterior of your home.
- "See Something, Say Something" –
 A vigilant community is a safer community.
 If you notice a person or vehicle that seems suspicious, contact police dispatch (732-827-2200) with as much information as possible. In case of an emergency, dial 9-1-1 immediately.

SOLID WASTE CONTAINER

GUIDELINES

The Rahway Department of Public Works has provided the following guidelines to streamline the solid waste collection process and reduce the risk of injury to our collection staff.

- Must be less than 32 gallons
- Must weigh less than 40lbs
- Must NOT have wheels
- Must have solid handles
- Must have detachable lids
- Must have drainage holes
- Must be in good condition

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Yard waste collection begins on April 1st and will be collected on your first collection day of the week. Please make sure that all yard waste is in either a brown paper bag or a sturdy garbage can with handles. Yard waste cans should be 32 gallons in size or less with detachable lids. Oversized containers, containers weighing more than 40lbs, and yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected.



STREET SWEEPER SCHEDULE

Street sweeping in the City of Rahway begins on April 1, 2024 and runs through October. Please follow all parking signs in your neighborhood.
