




In May 2024, the Rahway Arts District Park, located



WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE UPDATE

As of June 1, 2024, the City of Rahway is proud to report that approximately 4,700 service lines have already been tested out of the ~5,300 required for the Water Quality Assurance Initiative project. As such, the City celebrates the significant progress made possible through resident cooperation. Spearheaded by Mayor Raymond Giacobbe and Rahway City Council, the Water Quality Assurance Initiative works not only to ensure the integrity of Rahway's water supply but also to ensure a safer and brighter future for Rahway residents to thrive. Test pitting, a crucial phase of the project, is slated for completion by the end of June, marking a significant milestone in Rahway's journey towards a more resilient future. However, the journey doesn't end there. Since the test pit work commenced in November 2023, temporary restoration of the test pits was utilized due to the winter conditions. However, recognizing the urgency of the situation, the City had the

contractor triple their Restoration Crews starting in April, demonstrating a steadfast commitment to minimizing wait times and expediting the restoration process. Currently, final restoration times are expected to be in the 2-4 week range. Residents can anticipate up to 100 service lines will undergo replacement between now and October. Following the completion of this phase, plans will be set in motion for the replacement of all water service lines confirmed to consist of lead or have galvanized components. Right-of-entry (ROE) forms will be provided to properties requiring water service line replacement. Early approval by property owners of these forms ensures that the work can be carried out at no charge, an opportunity made possible thanks to the strategic foresight of the City leadership, securing multiple millions in grants from County, State, and Federal levels. As properties await restoration, the City extends its deepest appreciation for the



community's patience and active participation in the process to ensure a safer future for the City. For the latest updates on the project's status, residents are encouraged to contact the engineering department at engineering@cityofrahway.com or 732-827-2176. Test pit results are available as soon as 24 hours after the completion of each test pit, ensuring transparency and accountability every step of the way.

REMEMBER TO SUMMER SAFELY!

As summer approaches, everyone looks forward to outdoor fun and relaxation. However, safety should be a top priority. Here is how to stay safe and healthy while enjoying the season's activities.

Shield Yourself from The Sun's Rays

To prevent sunburn and skin damage, wear broad-spectrum sunscreen with a high SPF, and reapply every two hours, especially after swimming or sweating. Avoid direct sunlight between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., and wear light-colored, breathable clothing. Hats and sunglasses offer extra protection.

Beat The Heat

Hydration is crucial in hot weather. Drink water regularly and take breaks during outdoor activities. If you feel overheated, find shade or use air conditioning to cool down. Avoid overexertion to prevent heat exhaustion.

Practice Water Safety

Learning to swim is a critical safety measure. Always supervise children near water and use life jackets when boating or kayaking. In natural bodies of water, stick to designated areas, and be aware of currents and submerged hazards. Install safety barriers around home pools to prevent unsupervised access.



The Property Tax Reimbursement Program reimburses eligible seniors and disabled persons for property tax increases.

Income Limit

\$150,000 for the tax years 2022 & 2023.

Age/Disability

Must have turned 65 in 2022(the first year you can apply is the year you turn 67) or are receiving Federal Social Security disability benefits.

Residency

Lived in your current home for the last three years.

The City of Rahway would like to remind all residents that the maximum size for garbage cans is 32 gallons. It has come to our attention that some households are using garbage cans that exceed this limit, which can lead to various issues for our waste management team and the community. Using oversized garbage cans can result in several problems:

- Difficulty in handling and emptying the cans by our sanitation workers.
- Increased risk of injury for our staff due to the excessive weight of larger cans.
- Potential overflow of garbage, leading to unsightly and unsanitary conditions.
- Inconsistency in the appearance of our neighborhoods.

To maintain a clean, safe, and efficient waste management system, we kindly ask all residents to adhere to the 32-gallon limit for garbage cans. If you currently own a larger can, please replace it with a 32-gallon or smaller container as soon as possible.
